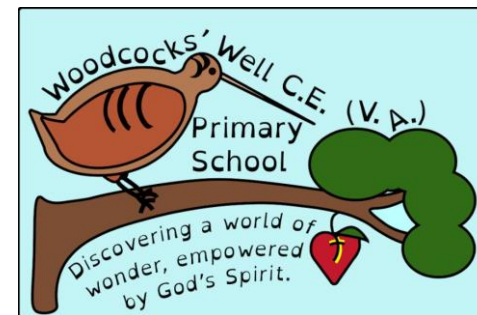


PE and Sports Premium Grant

2021 - 2022



The government provided an extra £320 million of annual funding for the academic years of 2020 - 2021. The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) and Sports programmes offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governmental departments, including Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport. Although the funding will be allocated to primary school Headteachers, it will be 'ring fenced' - this means that it can only be spent specifically on PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, though how they do this remains their decision.

This is how Woodcocks' Well CE (VA) Primary School has used the funding in 2020 - 2021:

- Paying for qualified sports coaches to provide extra-curricular school clubs to develop skills in specific sports so that parental economic factors do not impact upon participation.
- Purchasing motivational resources to engage pupils to be active during break-times.
- Improve facilities to engage pupils in 30 minutes of activity a day.
- Improve fine and gross motor skills within the Early Years.

For the academic year 2021-2022, Woodcocks' Well CE (VA) Primary School was allocated £16,912 of sports funding. On top of this the school had a small carry forward from previous years. Below you will find a full breakdown of how the sports funding has been allocated and the impact of this.
